From the Pastor

We've almost made it. Another year is about to be written into the history books. It has been an interesting year, to say the least. 

Take time this New Year - take time to enjoy God's creation; take time to enjoy the blessings He richly showers on you; take time to study His Word and grow in it; take time to worship and praise the God who made you, redeemed you and sanctifies you; take time to return to God a portion of the bounty He showers upon you.




President's Message

Transfiguration Sunday is February 10, 2013. Ash Wednesday will be the first of the midweek services, on February 13. All mid-week services will begin at 7:00 pm with a soup supper preceding at 6:00 pm.

Holy Week starts with Palm Sunday on March 17. Maundy Thursday and Good Friday services begin at 7:00 pm.

Easter Sunrise Service starts bright and early at 6:30 am in Sylvan Beach on March 24, followed by morning worship at 10:00 am.




service. We hope our guests felt welcome and refreshed by what you saw and heard that morning in our midst. God has redeemed us, JUBILEE!


